### **“PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENT”**

The Bureau of Land Management, Nevada State Office is pleased to announce the conclusion of the Cadastral Survey records scanning project with the completion of the original field note tablets. Cadastral Survey data/information as well as Title Records information can be found at the website [www.blm.gov/nv](http://www.blm.gov/nv). Click on “Information Center” and select “Land Records Search”. The following is a list of data/information you can expect to find:

- Title Records
  - Master Title Plat (MTP)
  - Historical Indices (HI)
  - USE Plat
- Geographic Coordinate Data Base (GCDB) township coordinates
- Public Land Survey System (PLSS) survey information
  - “Original” and “Resurvey” GLO/BLM township plats and field notes (complete)
  - Mineral Survey plats and field notes
  - Homestead Entry plats and field notes
  - Townsite Survey plats
  - Indian Reservation Survey plats
  - Military Reservation Survey plats
  - Mineral and Homestead Entry Connection Sheets

To facilitate searching for those individuals unfamiliar with the Township/Range/Section descriptive identifier of the Public Lands, a map of Nevada is provided to help select your area of interest. Click the “County” enclosing your desired area; next, select the “Surface Management Status” (100K Quad) map with the desired area; and then select the “Township” with the desired area. Data/information for the selected township will populate the screen.

Additionally, external links have been added to the site for easy access to Legacy Rehost 2000 (LR2000); GLO Records (patent search); and GIS information (Geospatial mapping data).
